

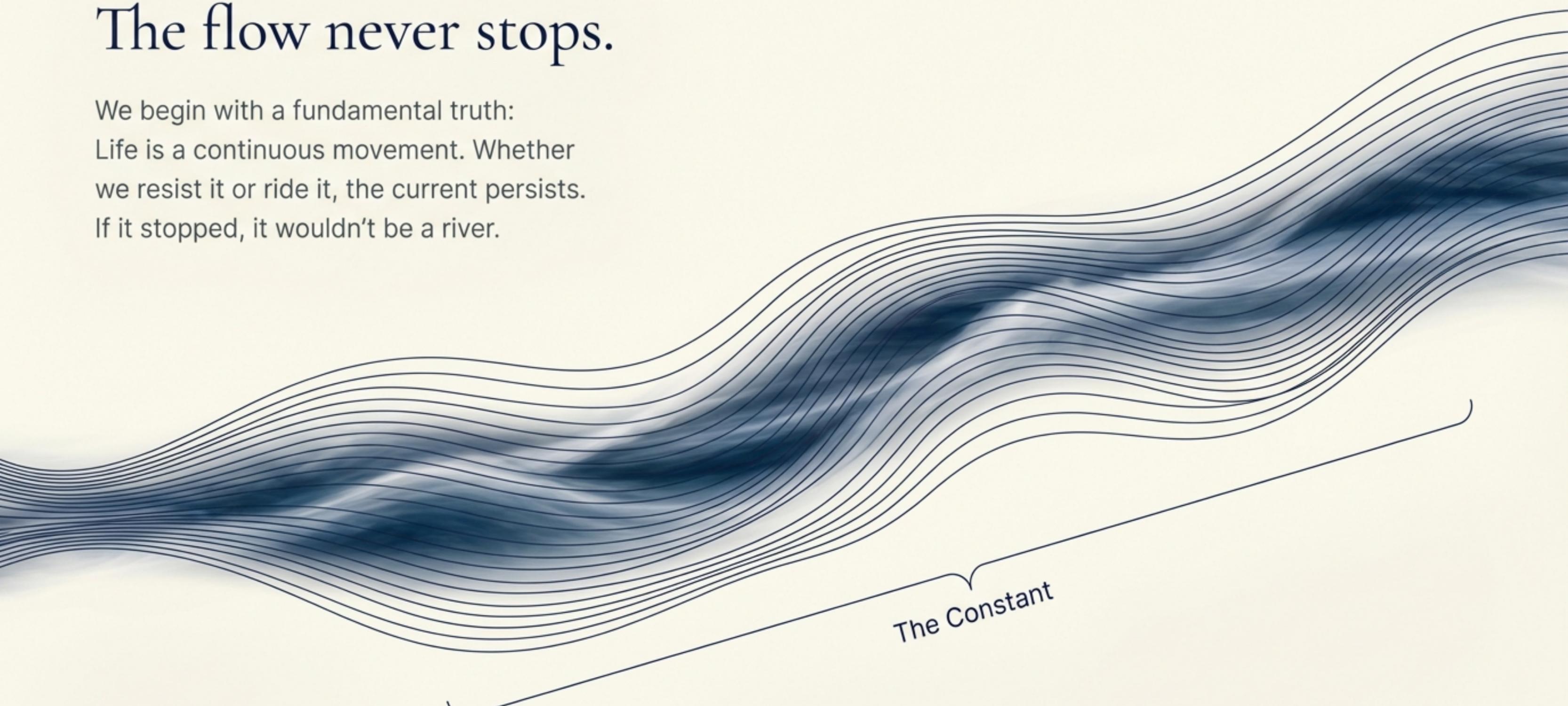
The River of Life

The flow never stops.

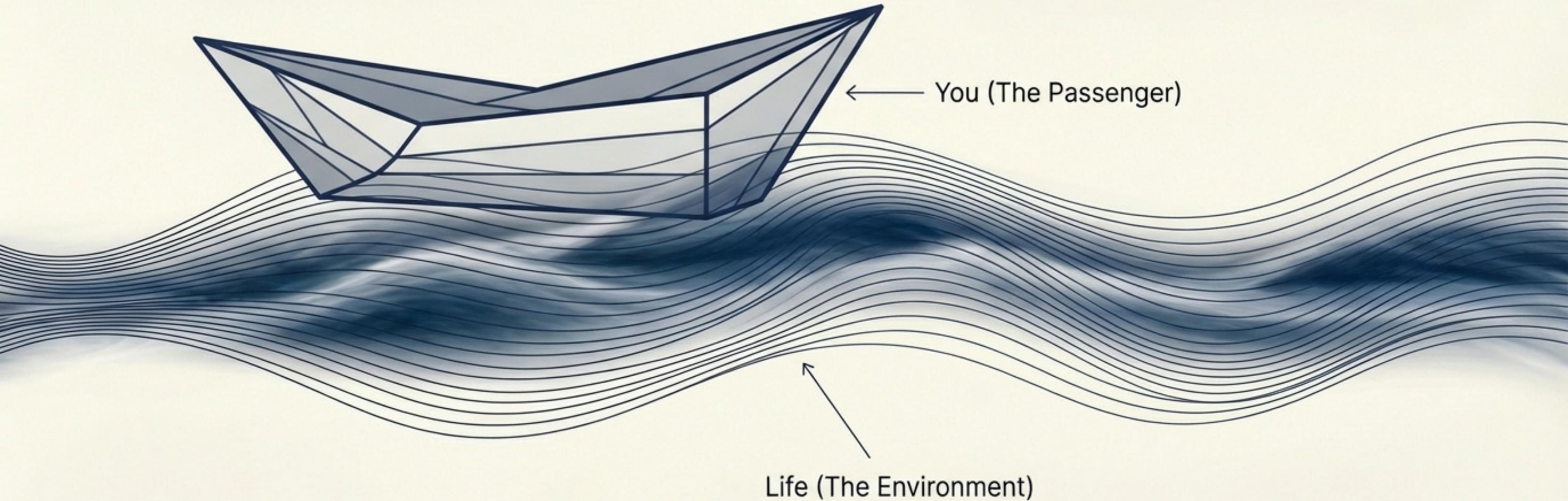
We begin with a fundamental truth:

we resist it or ride it, the current persists.
If it stopped, it wouldn't be a river.



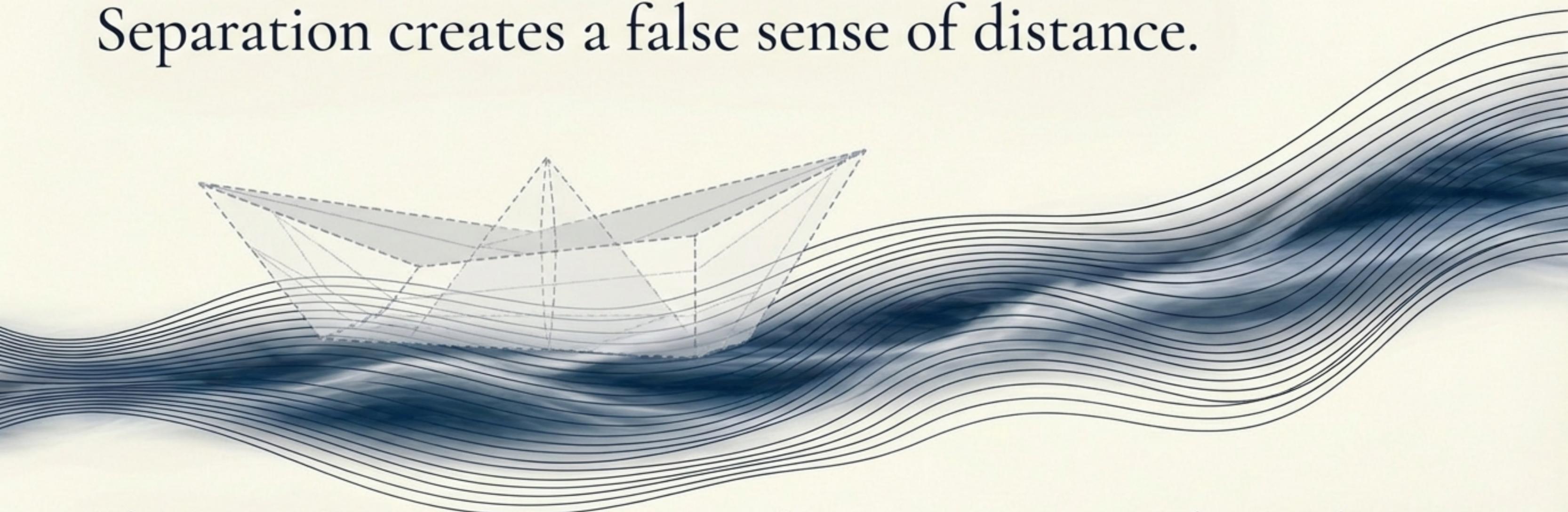
The Constant

The Illusion of the Passenger

Imagine you are a passenger on a large boat travelling down this river. You perceive yourself as an entity distinct from the flow, protected by the hull, observing the movement from a position of separation.



Separation creates a false sense of distance.



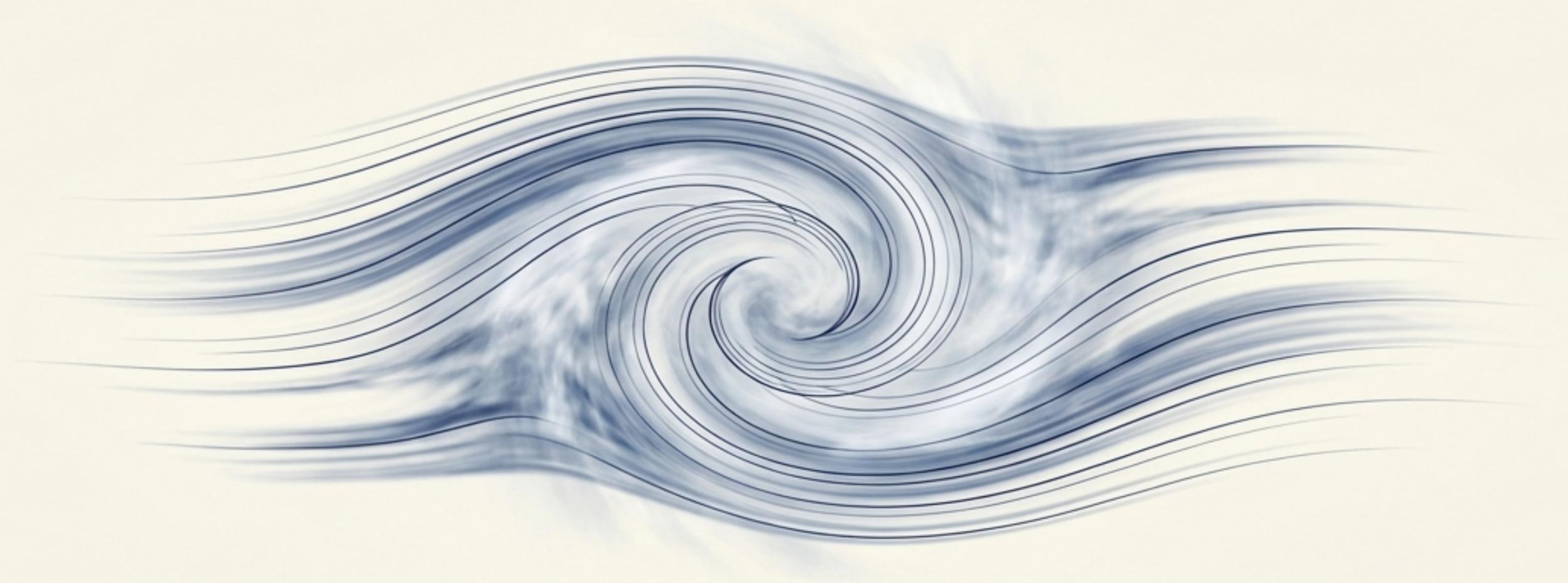
The Boat View

Living 'On' the water.
Implies control, separation, and duality.

The Reality

Living 'Of' the water. Implies
immersion, unity, and non-duality.

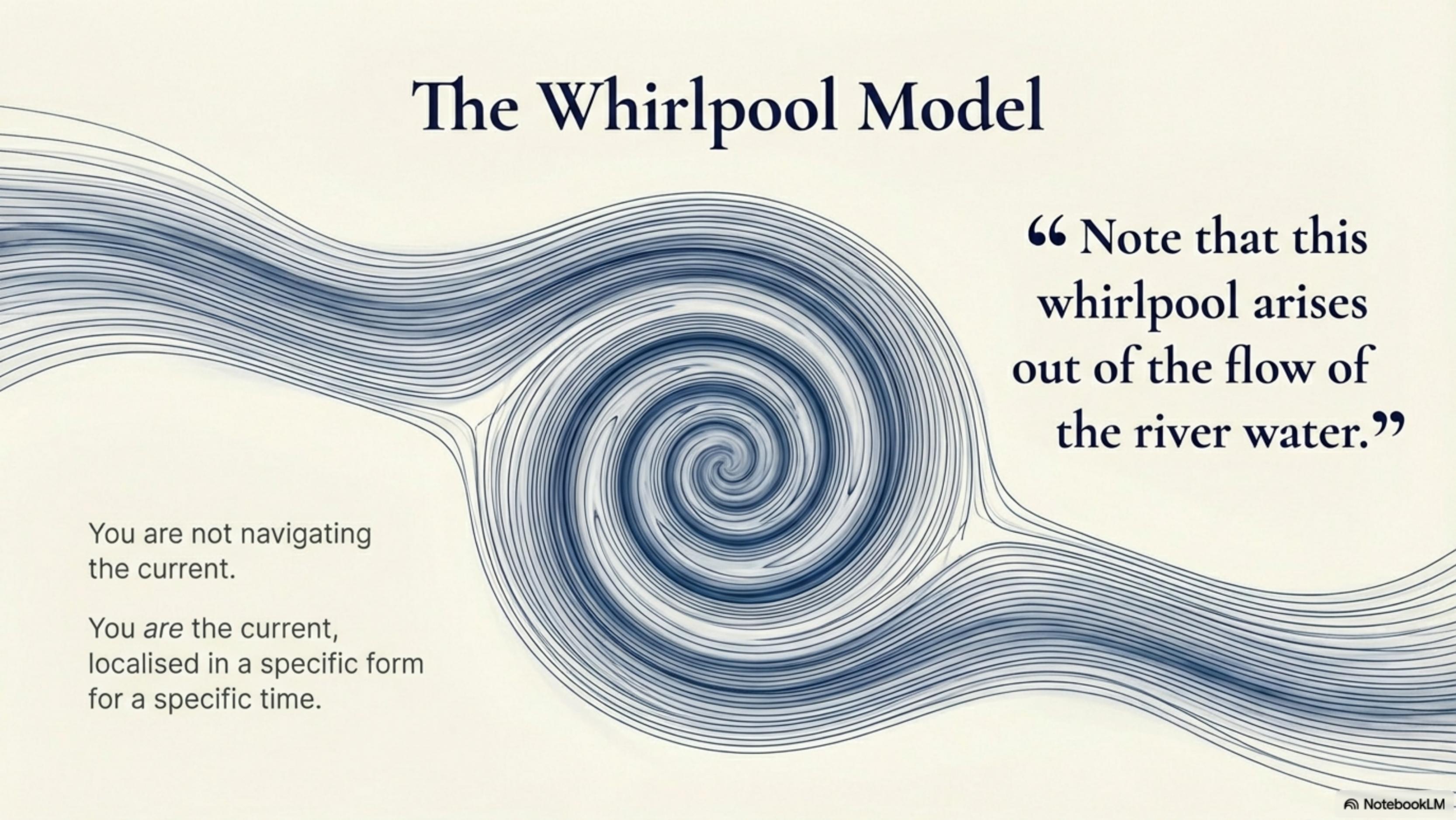
Viewing life as a passenger assumes a duality: there is 'you', and there is 'the river'.
But this model fails to account for the true nature of being.



Stop the boat. Become the water.
Shift your perspective.

Now, imagine that instead of being a passenger, you are a whirlpool within the river.

The Whirlpool Model



“ Note that this whirlpool arises out of the flow of the river water.”

You are not navigating the current.

You *are* the current, localised in a specific form for a specific time.

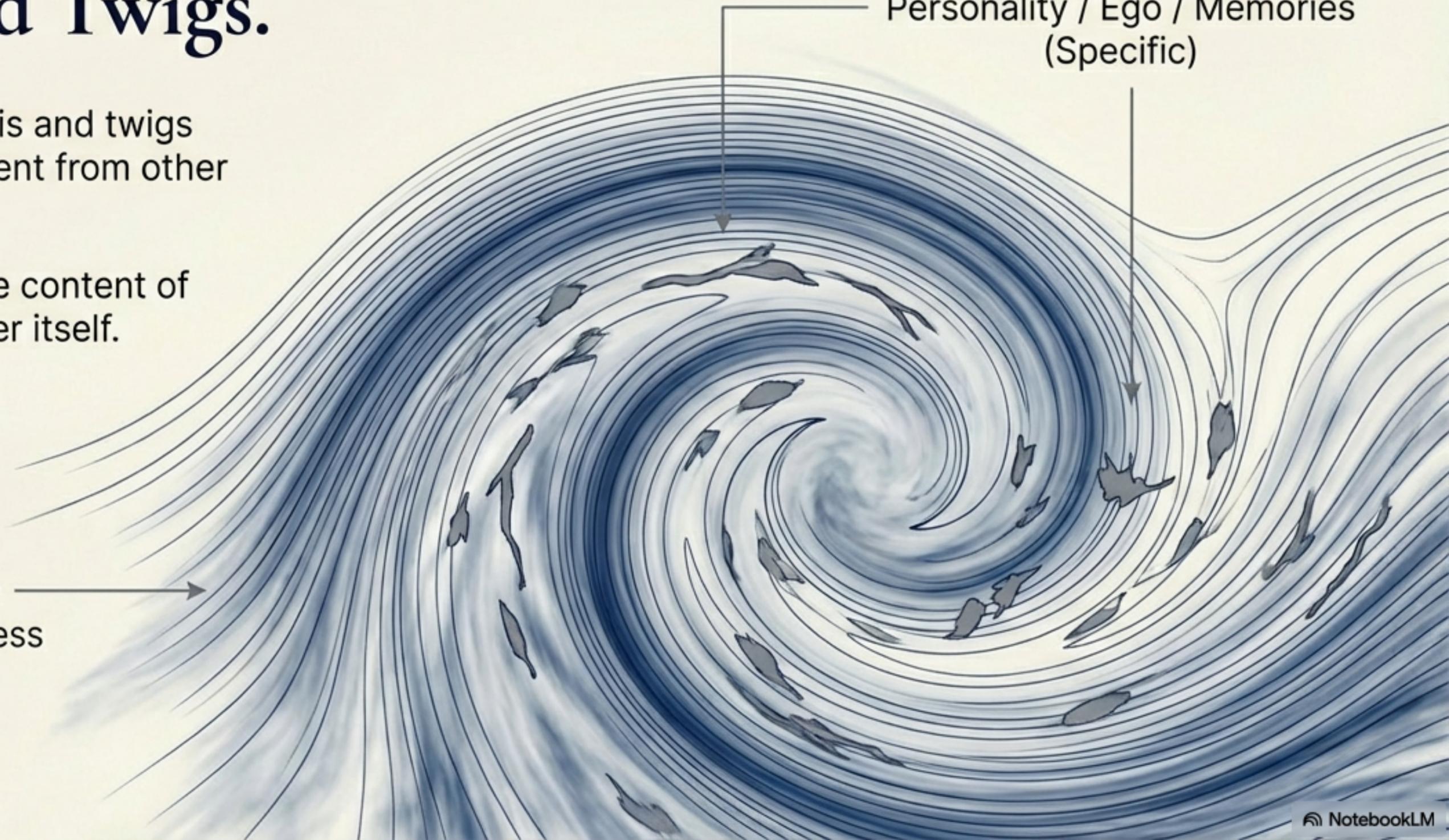
The illusion of difference: Debris and Twigs.

You have some debris and twigs
that make you different from other
whirlpools.

We often mistake the content of
our swirl for the water itself.

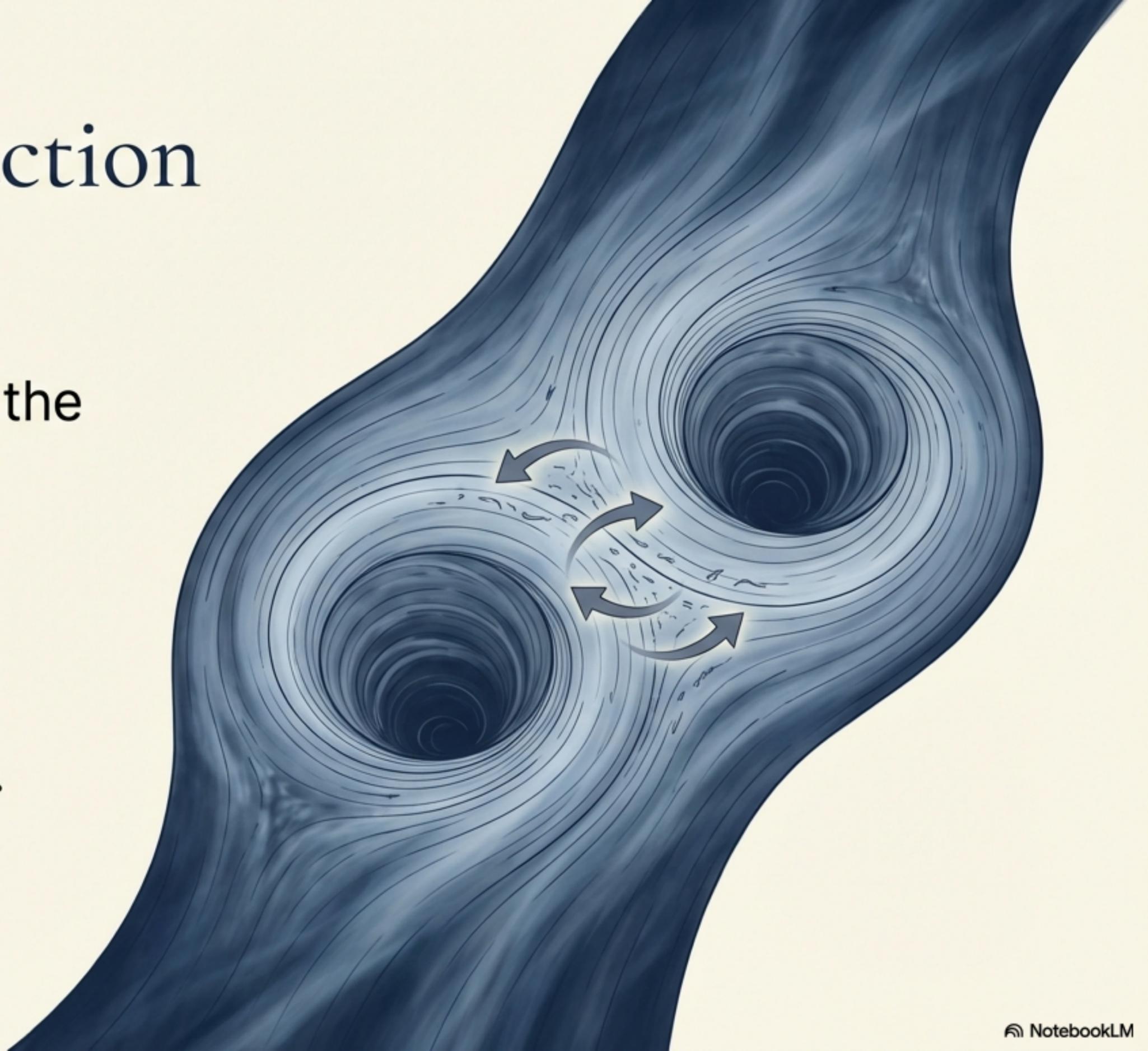
The Water =
Consciousness
(Universal)

The Debris =
Personality / Ego / Memories
(Specific)



Dynamic Interaction

You interact with other whirlpools and whatever the river has to offer. These interactions are fluid exchanges between dynamic systems, not collisions of solid objects.



Sustained by the Source

The water of the whirlpool is the water of the river. It exists for a time, sustained entirely by the flow.

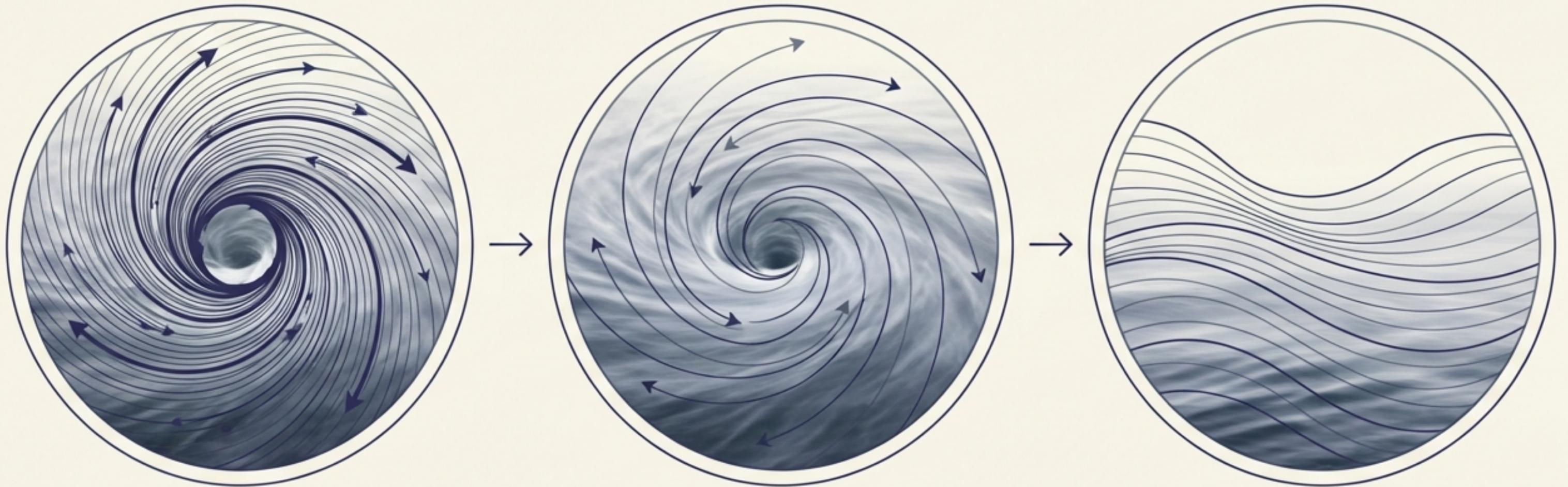


If the river stops, the whirlpool ceases to exist.



Return to the River

Eventually, the form relaxes. The whirlpool returns to the river out of which it came. It does not die; it loses its definition and reclaims its vastness.



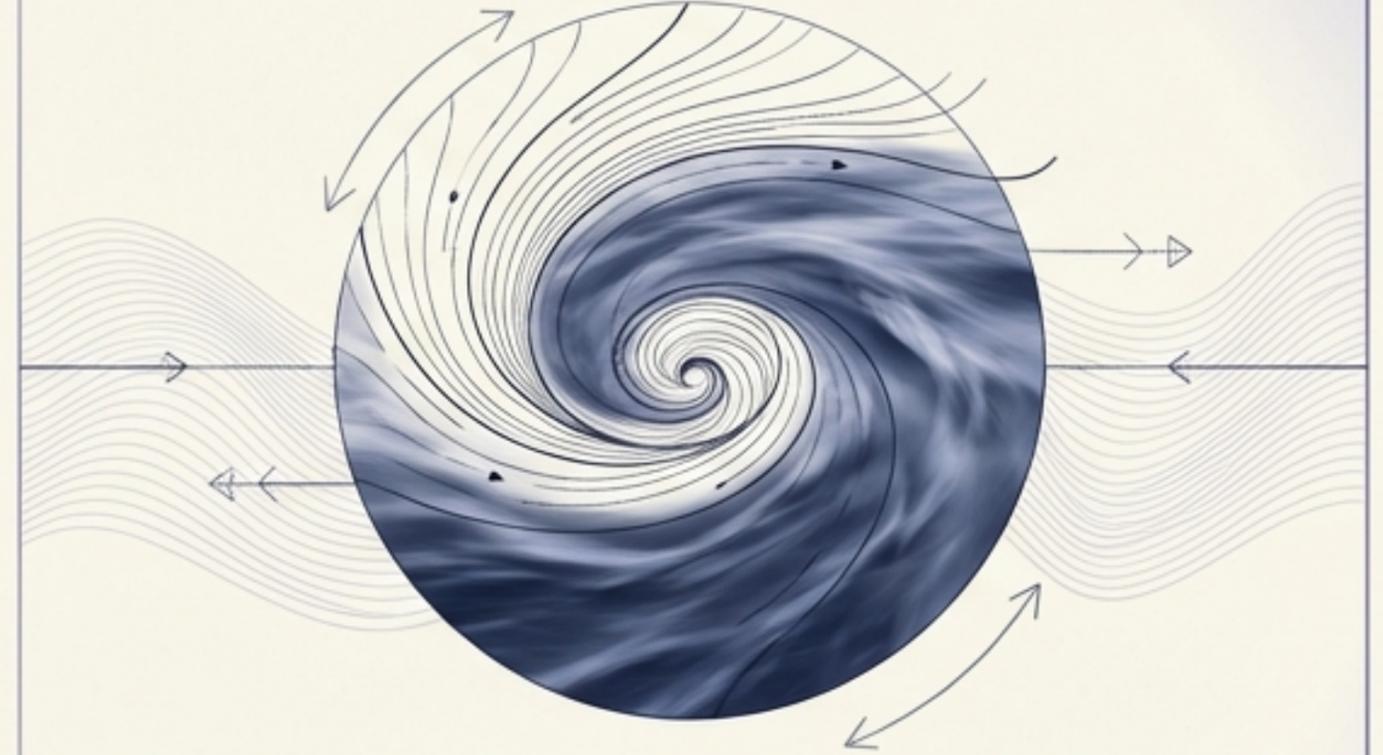
Two Ways to View Existence

The Boat (Dualism)



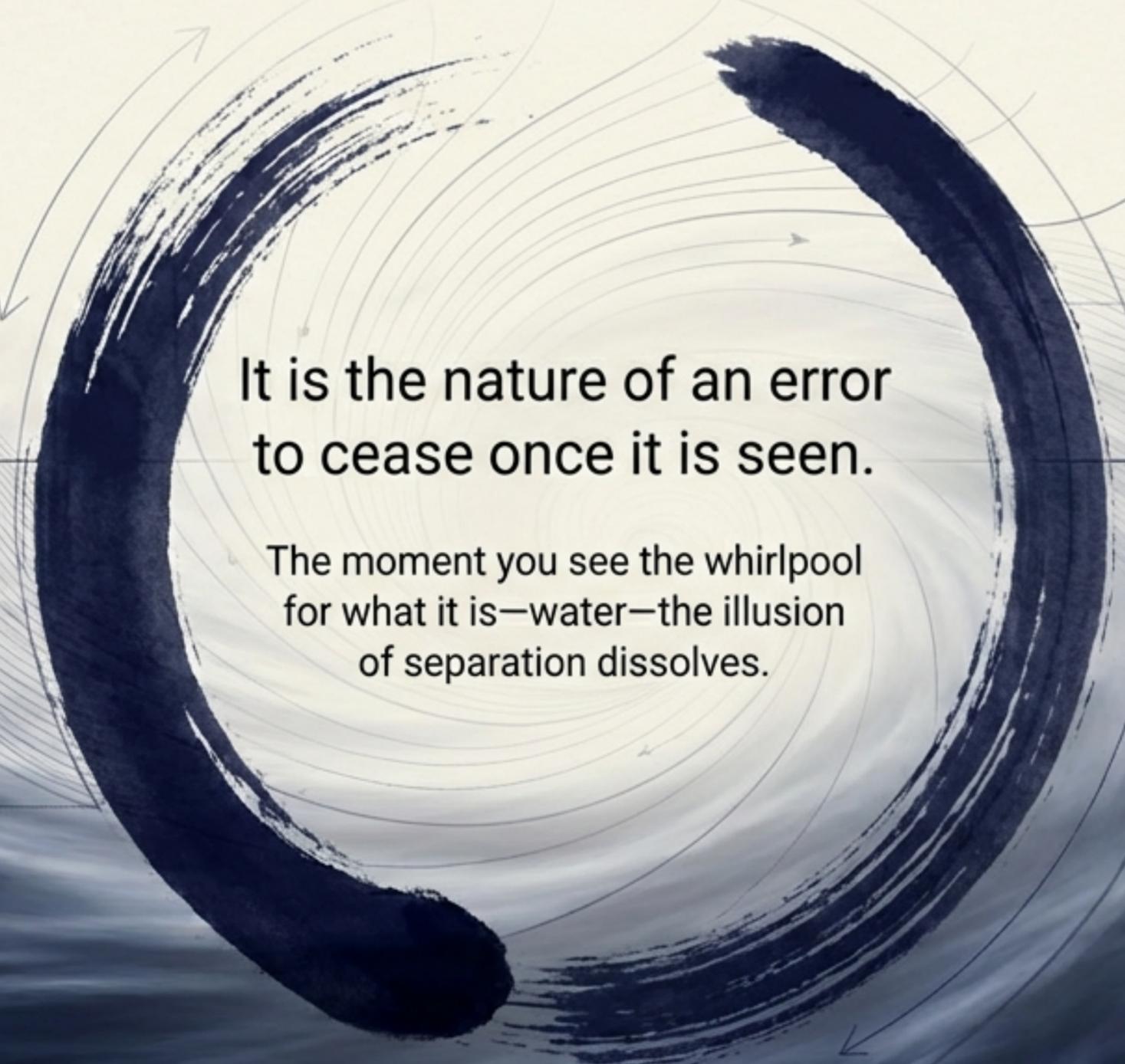
- Identity: Passenger
- Nature: Separate & Static
- Relationship: Resisting or navigating

The Whirlpool (Non-Dualism)



- Identity: Manifestation
- Nature: Unified & Dynamic
- Relationship: Being and flowing
