Etymology:


Pra [forth/constant]

# The Resonance of Logos and Vak

## The Gospel of John

John 1:1

“In the beginning was the Word,  
and the Word was with God, and  
and the Word was God.”

Refers to the **Greek Logos**—the  
pre-existent divine agent of creation.

## Vedic Tradition

The Sanskrit Parallel

*“Prajapati vai idam agra asit.  
Tasya vak dvitiya asit.  
Vag vai parama Brahman.”*

Translation: “In the beginning was  
**Prajapati** (the Creator), with him was  
the Word (**Vak**), and the Word was  
verily the Supreme **Brahman**.”

# A blueprint of reality across traditions


Feature	Gospel of John	Vedic Tradition
Primordial Term	Logos (The Word)	Vak (Speech) / Shabda (Sound)
Relationship	The Word was with God and was God.	The Word was with Prajapati and was Brahman.
Role	The agent of creation (“All things were made through Him”).	The vehicle of manifestation (creation as a projection of sound).

# From Silence to Sound and back again



In many Indian traditions, the '*Word*' is the cosmic sound **AUM (Om)**, the primordial vibration from which the universe was projected. Just like the primordial sound, all forms come out of Silence, are surrounded by Silence, and return to Silence. *Silence, God, Love, Energy, Prana*—whatever name you prefer—is Source and Substance.

# Your BodyMind is like a whirlpool in a river



It is the nature of a river to flow. When the river's flow is in formation, a whirlpool form appears. That form is made out of nothing but the water of the river.

# The Whirlpool has form, but the River is the substance

The River is Source by whatever name.


The Whirlpool is **You**.


# Philosophy and Fact
