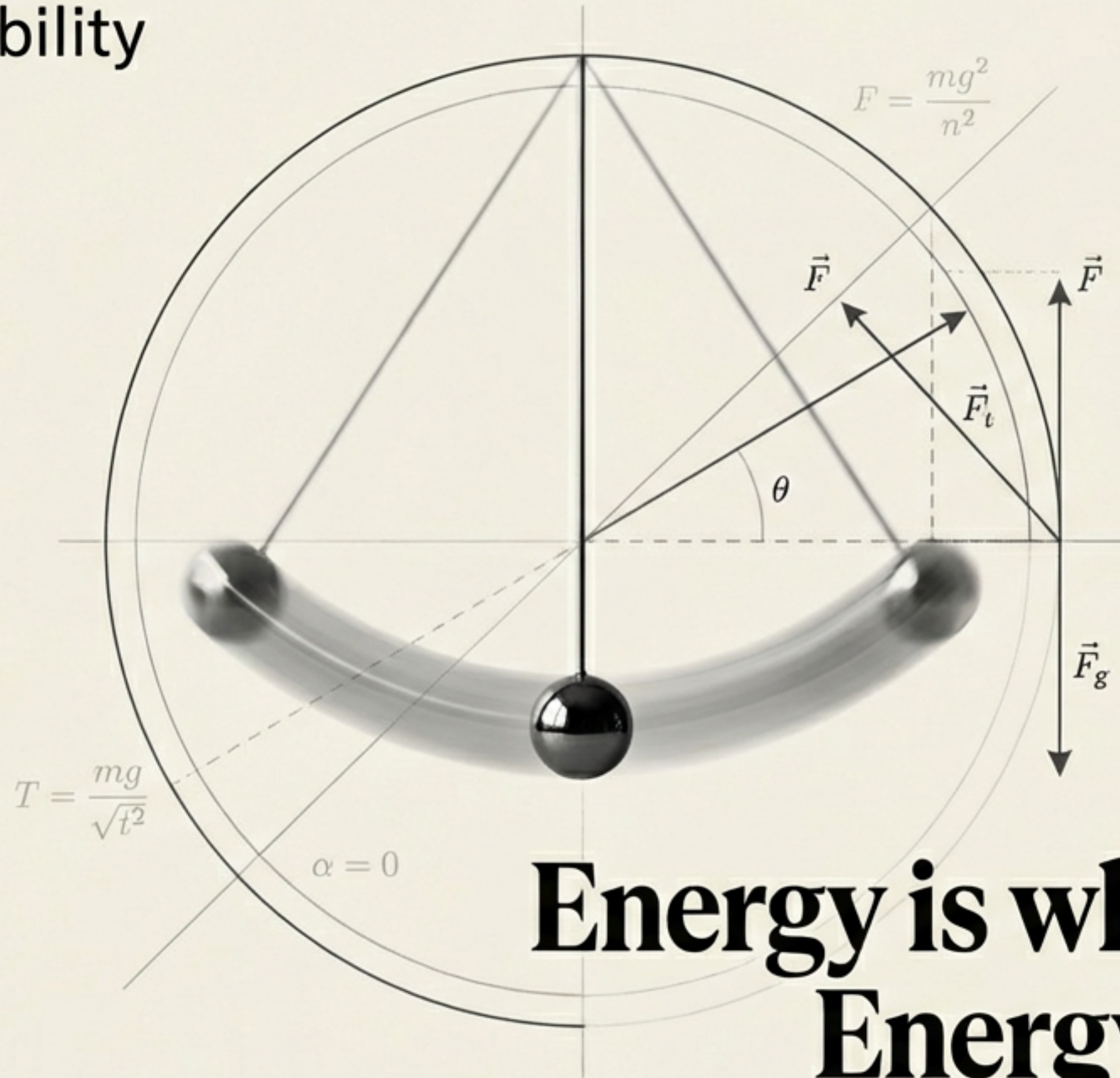
Love is defined

Love is a function.

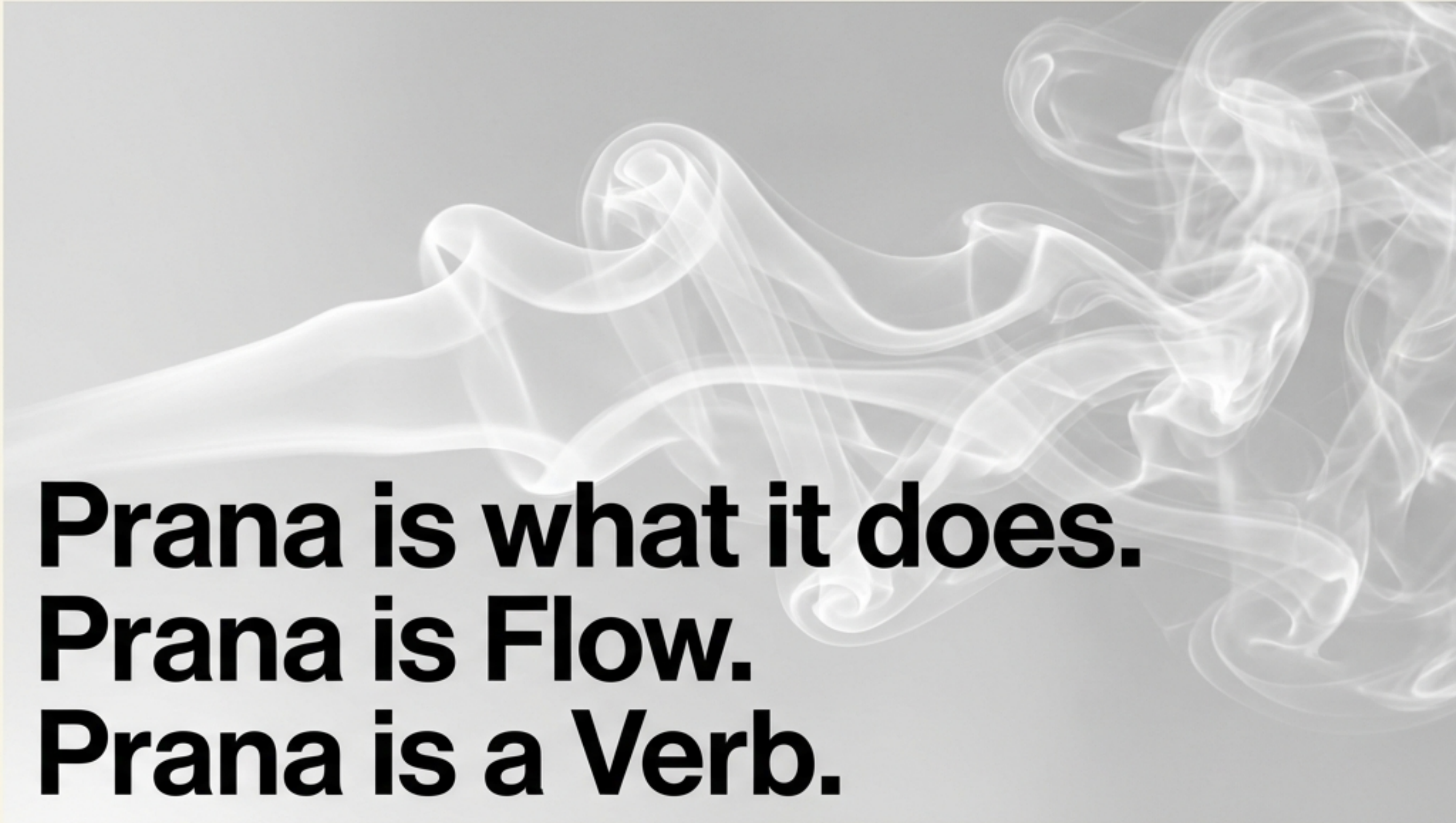
Energy is the ability
to do work

Scientifically, we do not
know what Energy 'is' in
essence; we only
understand it via what it
'does'. It is defined
entirely by its capacity for
action.



Energy is what it does.
Energy is a Verb.

Prana is the breath within the breath



The root meaning of Prana is specific: 'Pra' (forth/constant) + 'Ana' (to breathe, move, live). It stands for the 'Life Force', the 'Vital Principle', or the 'Animating Principle'.

Flow is the unified nature of reality

If Love, Energy, and Prana are all defined by their action—by what they “do”—then they are interchangeable. Flow is the one term that accurately represents all three.

All so-called “things” are Flow in Form, through Form, and out of Form.

In the beginning was the Word

This phrase reflects a significant cross-cultural comparison between Christian theology and Vedic philosophy. Both traditions pinpoint a “divine word” or sound as the origin origin of the universe.



The Divine Agent in Christian Theology

“In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.” — John 1:1

In this context, 'the Word' (the Greek *Logos*) refers to the pre-existent Jesus Christ as the divine agent of creation. It is the active principle of God.

The Vehicle of Manifestation in
Vedic Cosmogony.

“Prajapati vai idam agra
asit. Tasya vak dvitiya asit.
Vag vai parama
Brahman.” — Rig Veda

“In the beginning was Prajapati (the
Creator), with him was the Word
(Vak), and the Word was verily the
Supreme Brahman.”

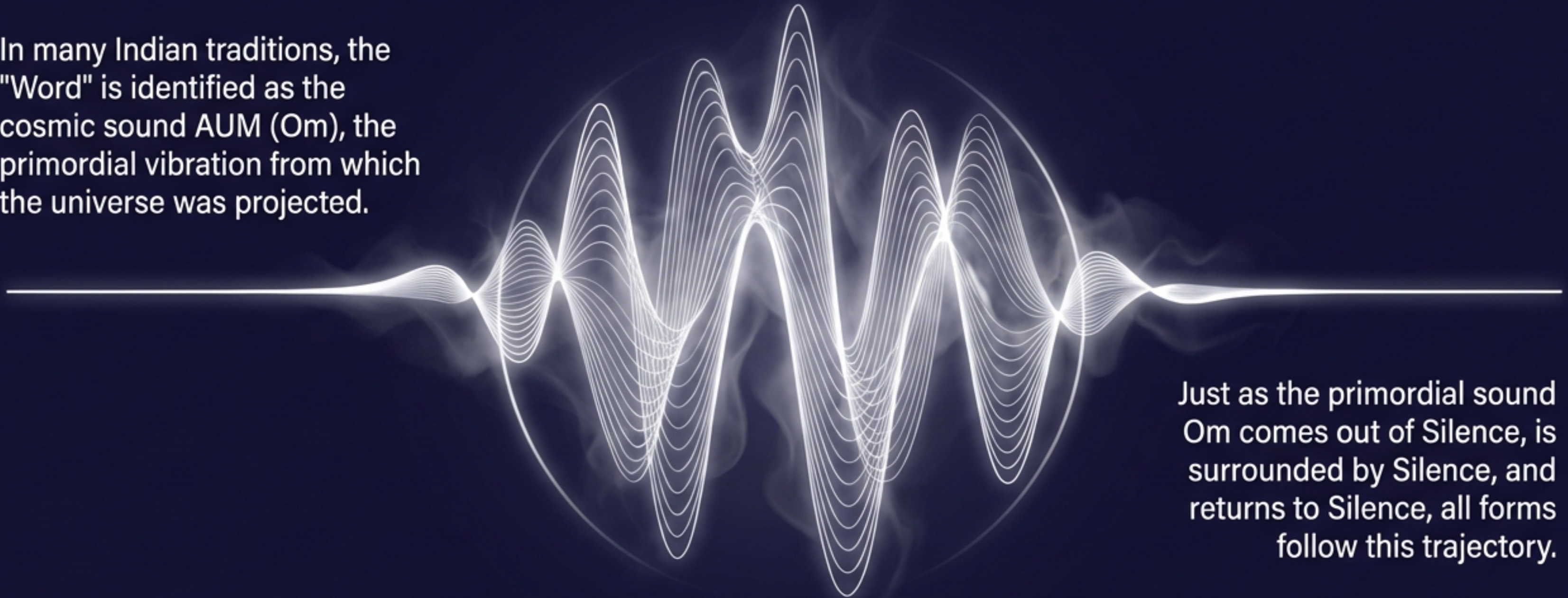
Here, Vak (Speech) is central.
Creation is viewed as a projection of sound.

The Architecture of Creation is Universal

Feature	Gospel of John	Vedic Tradition
Primordial Term	Logos (The Word)	Vak (Speech) / Shabda (Sound)
Relationship	The Word was with God and was God.	The Word was with Prajapati and was Brahman.
Role	The agent of creation ('All things were made through Him').	The vehicle of manifestation (creation as projection of sound).

From Silence to Sound and back again

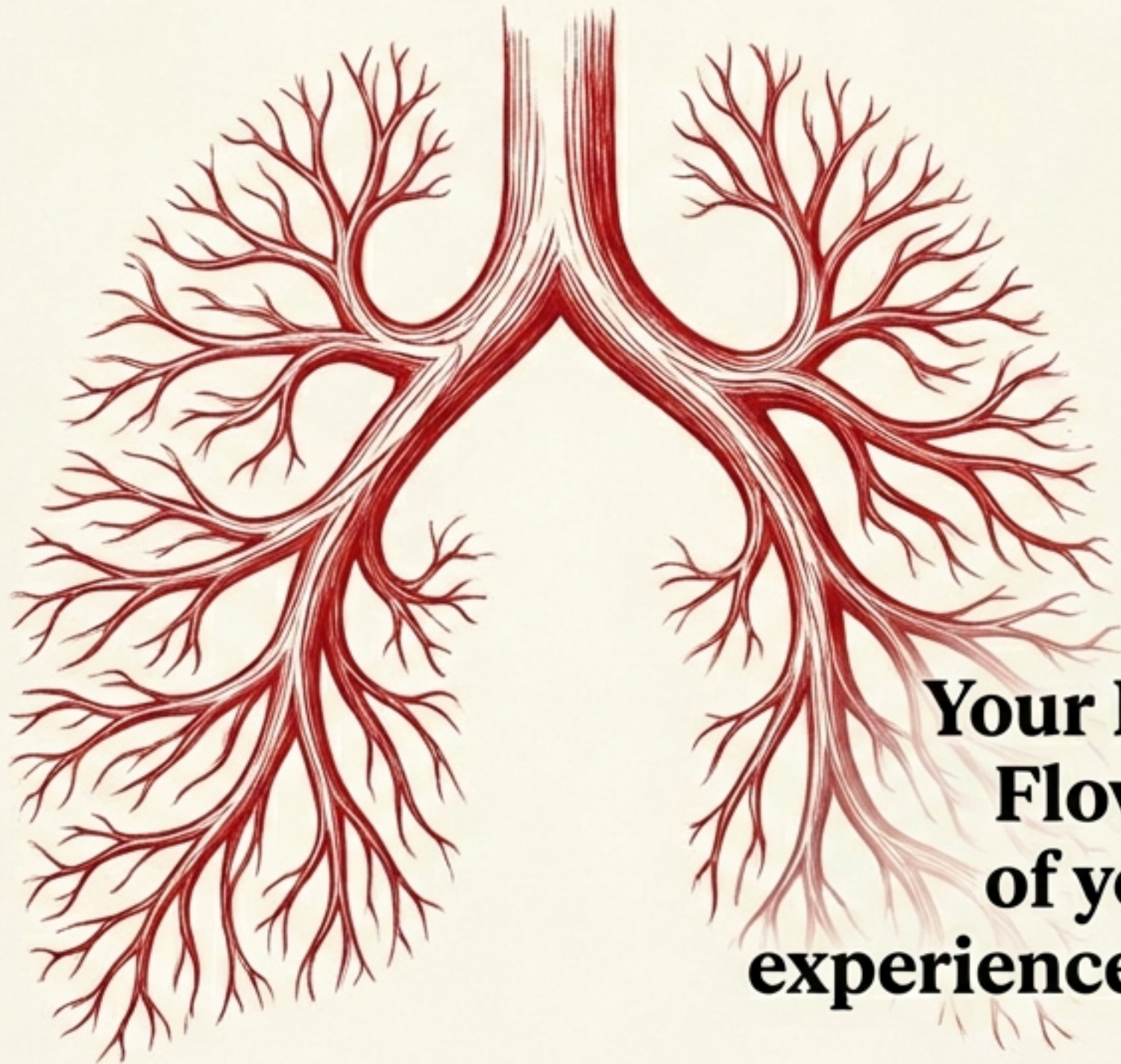
In many Indian traditions, the "Word" is identified as the cosmic sound AUM (Om), the primordial vibration from which the universe was projected.



Just as the primordial sound Om comes out of Silence, is surrounded by Silence, and returns to Silence, all forms follow this trajectory.

Silence, God, Love, Energy, Prana, or whatever name you prefer, is Source and Substance.

Your breath is the bridge to understanding

**Your Breathing as Breath Flow and Blood
Flow is the bridge to the understanding
of your True Nature. It is the immediate
experience of the 'Word' or 'Prana' within you.**

The Source is the River

It is the nature of a river to flow. The River is the Source by whatever name (God, Brahman, Silence). The River represents the undifferentiated potential—the substance from which all things are made.
